Child Safety @ St Bede's

It is critical that processes are in place to embed a culture of Child Safety by ensuring that Child Safety is a constant focus for any person at St Bede's involved in 'child connected work' in our school community.

Processes in place at St Bede's

- Digital visitor sign in / out
- All staff including CRTs sign code of conduct
- Annual mandatory reporting professional learning
- Risk assessments are conducted for events
- Child Safety Team meet regularly to audit processes

Steps to take if you are feeling unsafe

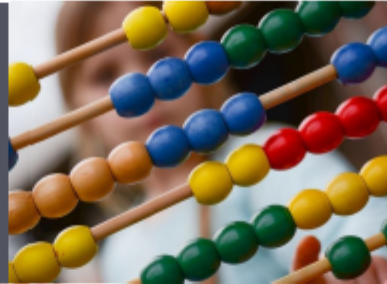
- Tell a trusted adult
- Telling a trusted adult will not get you in trouble
- Adults at school will listen to you and help
- A trusted adult may need to tell another adult so you can be helped
- Other people who can help are the kid's Help Line 1800 551 800
- If you are worried that another person is unsafe you should tell a trusted adult
